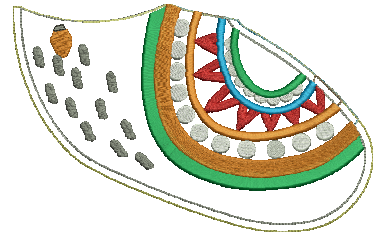
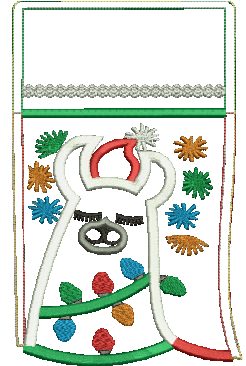
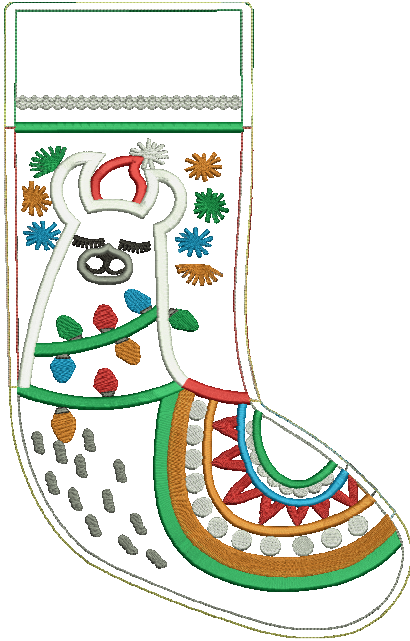


In the Hoop Llama Stocking



Materials:

Fabrics:

Green 8x4, 5x1.5" for tab

Red 8x9,

White for foot-8x12 White for top 8x9 (2 times)

Blue 6x7,

Orange-5x5.5

Fabric for back 13x19

Fabric for lining 13x38

Batting-8x12 for foot 8x12 for body,

Iron on interfacing 12x36

Sticky Back Stabilizer- 2 times what fits in your large hoop minimum size
hoop is 8x12 for this design.

All usual machine embroidery and appliqué supplies.

1. Choose the foot for the first design. Hoop Sticky stabilizer without peeling the protective paper off.
2. Stitch first color. Stop the machine remove hoop. Score the paper inside the foot area, tear away protective paper leaving the sticky surface. Place batting over the sticky area removed.
3. Stitch second color. This ties down the batting. Carefully cut away batting as close as you can to stitching.
4. Score the paper around the foot and tear back protective paper revealing the sticky surface all around the batted foot.
5. Carefully lay the tail fabric covering the batting and at least 1/2 in around the batted area.
6. Follow appliqué steps for the blue and orange. There will be a placement line show where to place the fabric. Next stitch the cut line to remove excess fabric.
7. Finish the entire design.
8. Lets make the fringe. Turn design over use your seam ripper to carefully cut the bobbin thread only from the bottom of the llama blanket under the long green satin stitch.
9. The yellow stitching is the cutting line. Cut along those stitches. It will run 1/4 inch from the stitching line until it gets to the place where the foot meets the body portion of the stocking. The first half is finished. Set it aside for later.
